

SOIL Sangre de Cristo celebrates one year anniversary—Speaker series to be held on April 22

SOIL Sangre de Cristo held its first meeting virtually as the country started to close due to the pandemic in late March 2020. The timing was perfect. People in the communities throughout the south-central region of Colorado became concerned about keeping food on grocery store shelves and their families fed.

SOIL Sangre de Cristo supports local farmers, ranchers and other food producers, keeping our food economy resilient and sustainable. This is done by awarding 0% interest loans to these enterprises, furthering their success, a model based on Slow Money Principles developed by author/activist Woody Tasch. This mission is more important now than ever. Members in the community support SOIL Sangre de Cristo by becoming Investor Members with contributions to the loan fund. There are now over 60 members throughout the region.

Using the contributions from the Investor Members a permanent, member driven, revolving loan fund is created. The loans fund such crucial items as tractors, worker housing, irrigation, walk-in coolers, hoop houses and washing equipment.

SOIL Sangre de Cristo encompasses the south-central region of Colorado. This includes Chaffee, Saguache and Alamosa coun-

ties. It also includes the western part of Fremont County (Howard); Rio Grande County, including Del Norte and Monte Vista; Costilla; and Conejos counties. SOIL Sangre de Cristo is one of 4 regions in Colorado. The others are located in the Carbondale/Aspen area, Durango/Four Corners area, and Boulder.

The second round of loans was just completed, awarding loans to Badger Creek Ranch and Jumpin' Good Goat Dairy, LLC. To date SOIL Sangre de Cristo has awarded \$20,000.00 in the first year.

To celebrate the One-Year Anniversary, SOIL Sangre de Cristo is holding a membership drive, through April 30, recognizing the partnership with The Mighty Arrow Family Foundation. Since the beginning, The Mighty Arrow Family Foundation has awarded a 50% match to each of the contributions helping to significantly grow the loan fund. SOIL Sangre de Cristo is grateful for the support of The Mighty Arrow Family Foundation and its recognition of the importance of preserving the farming and ranching heritage of this region. Liz will also explain the history of heritage grains and their connection with the small flour mills that proliferated in the United States during the late 1800s.
